Bishop Michael	Bishop Michael was enthroned as the 40th Bishop of Gloucester in Gloucester Cathedral during May 2004. Formerly, he was Dean of Derby. He is the author or editor of fourteen books on theology, liturgy and spirituality. As a member of the Church of England Liturgical Commission from 1986 to 2001, Michael Perham also played a major part in the production of the Church of England's Common Worship. Bp Michael is married to Alison, a palliative care specialist. They have four daughters.
Stuart Bexon	Aged 64, married to Val, (an ordinand training at Wycliffe Hall, Oxford), Stuart is also reading Theology at Wycliffe on a 2yr diploma course. Both are hoping to walk the Camino de Santiago – a 500 mile pilgrimage in Northern Spain. Stuart currently worships at Northleach where he is a Eucharistic minister, PCC members, Deanery Synod rep, and Eco-Officer for the Deanery. Previously churchwarden at St Catherine's Westonbirt.
Mark Bick	Community musician, working mostly with young people. Born and brought up in Gloucestershire, and lives and works in Cinderford. Mark has served as churchwarden and church music leader, and his wife Sarah is an ordinand.
Craig Bishop	Craig is the curate from Thornbury. He is married to Ros and they have two young daughters Amelia and Ella. Before being ordained Craig was a junior school teacher. Craig enjoys mountains, cheese, chopping wood and learning.
Josie Goodwin	Josie lives in Alderton, worshipping at St Margaret of Antioch Church, where she is a bell-ringer, serves on the PCC and sings in the choir. Married with 2 children, she is a Human Resources Manager when she can fit it in. The pilgrimage gives her the chance to do some of her favourite things simultaneously: walking, talking, and worshipping.
Julia Hook	Julia is a 1 <sup>st</sup> year Ordinand studying with the West of England Ministry Training Course (WEMTC). She is the parish administrator at Christ Church, and worships in the Anglo-Catholic tradition at All Saints', Pittville, Cheltenham. She survived the London Marathon [just] and runs with 'Almost Athletes'.
David Humphries	David is a retired parish priest and is currently the Chaplain to the Gloucester Charities Trust.
Ingalill Wallin	Ingalill is 55, married to Olle for 34 years, and they have two grown up sons 32 and 28 years old. She works as a physiotherapist together with her husband, Olle, also a physiotherapist About 6-7 years ago, she started to visit their church for specially arranged retreats and groups for meditation, and has been taking part in some pilgrimages, the first one in 2004. She is also part of a pilgrimage, which started in 2005 and will end 2010 in Nidaros in Trondheim, Norway. Twice every summer they walk parts of the way.
