The Feeding the 5000 project has 2 aims:

1. Ensure everyone in Gloucestershire is fed throughout the duration of the Covid-19 crisis with delicious, locally cooked, nutritious food.
2. Create a network of community kitchens that will be able to serve their communities after the crisis. This means that the people who have had these ready meals are able, after the crisis has passed, to eat together as a gathered community.

This project builds on the expertise and model developed by The Long Table.

The Long Table is part of the Grace Network, a social enterprise based in Brimscombe, Stroud. They bring people together through food and run a bakery, kitchen, shop and a dining space where they provide delicious home-cooked, nutritious meals.

In response to the coronavirus crisis they quickly adapted their services to cook and deliver delicious, healthy meals to those self-isolating and most in need in the county.

The Long Table have joined forces with the Diocese of Gloucester, the Bishop of Gloucester and a series of community kitchens throughout the county who are cooking the meals feeding the 5000.
