WHY SHOULD YOU CARE ABOUT CLIMATE CHANGE?

This session provides a framework for a youthwork session introducing the subject of climate change/ environment issues to young people. It will explore the theology behind why we should care, what the issues are and how we can respond as Christians.

RESOURCES NEEDED

- Something to watch a YouTube video on, internet connection
- Washing line
- Pens and paper (use some scrap cut into the size and shape of Post-it™ notes)
- Wooden pegs
- Bibles

ICE BREAKER – COULD YOU COPE?

Get all the young people in the middle of the room / space. Imagine the room is a sliding scale – at one end is the statement “I could cope, no problem” the other is “I wouldn’t last five minutes.”

Ask a series of questions, in response to each one the young people have to position themselves in the room according to how well they think they could cope.

Suggested questions. **I could cope a week...**

- Without going to school
- Without my mobile phone
- Without access to a car
- Without having a shower
- Without eating meat
- Without having central heating
- Without my friends
- Without the internet

Introduce the session theme, and do a quick quiz to see how much we know about the climate crisis – you can get people to put their hand up, stand up or run to a section of the room to indicate their answer (correct answers in bold).

BIBLE STUDY

Hand out Bibles, or get young people to grab their Bible / Bible App.

Read Genesis 2:15-22 as a group and then discuss these questions:

- God gave the human race a role, what is it?
- Do we still have that same role today?
- God gave them boundaries of how they should consume in the Garden of Eden. Do we have boundaries on this earth of how much we can consume?

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DISCUSSION: CLIMATE CHANGE IS A JUSTICE ISSUE

In small groups, discuss the impact of these two statements from Laura's video:

- "The people who contribute the least, are impacted the most."
- "God calls on us to seek out the injustices in the world."

Have you ever thought of environment issues as a justice issue?

Does understanding the impact your choices have on the last and least on earth change the way you want to respond?

Does it make it more or less important an issue?

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ACTION

Set up a washing line across the room sectioned into the five following sections.

Me personally	My family	My school	Church / group	My community
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Give each young person a pile of scrap paper cut into squares (like Post-it™ notes but re-used!) and some wooden pegs.

Challenge each young person to come up with some small practical changes we can make in our lives, and then peg them onto the line in the relevant section.

For some inspiration, think about the following categories:

- Recycling
- Renewable energy / energy usage
- Food and diet choices
- Deforestation
- Gardens
- Fashion / clothes choices
- Travel

Discuss as a group which of these we are going to commit to. Particularly focus on those things as a youth group you could do together (eg reduce waste, not use paper crockery, turn the heating/lights off).

PRAY

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In small groups pray for each other, the commitments you have made and the move against the injustice of climate change on the world.
